
Cotswolds retreats

Dormy House Broadway

Reopened last month after a multi-million pound refurbishment, this 17th-century farmhouse and family-owned hotel is now a grownup country retreat. Interiors were overseen by the same design team as Le Manoir aux Quat' Saisons, while the gardens have been landscaped by Chelsea Flower Show gold-winner Chris Beardshaw. The action revolves around The Potting Shed "dining pub"; next door, the Garden Room serves a more refined menu by Michelin-starred chef John Wood. A spa will complete the package in 2014. The Folly Didmarton

A 16th-century Cotswolds-stone farmhouse has been transformed inside with whimsical colours and tactile fabrics by designer Joanna Berryman. Wooden floors are reclaimed railway sleepers, original beams have been painted in restful colours and the kitchen centrepiece is an evocatively wonky 1920s butcher's block. Forget notions of restrained rusticity, this is a riot of playfulness that makes the ideal base for a big get-together.

The Lion Inn

This 15th-century coaching inn has featured not only in restaurant and hotel reviews, but also interiors pages since it reopened last year. Exposed Cotswolds stone and Farrow & Ball greys provide a backdrop for worn leather armchairs, Louis XVI-style chairs, mounted antlers, antique rocking horses and playful notes such as a vintage Mickey Mouse mural. The Glove House

There are just two bedrooms at this new, bijou B&B: the Woodstock Suite, named after the village in which it's located; and the Bladon, named after the village on the other side of Blenheim Park, Inside, Fox Linton fabrics and lime white walls set a serene note, while free Wi-Fi, Nespresso machines, HD TV and mini bars bolster the luxury quotient. Downstairs in the Georgian townhouse, a wood-panelled drawing room with log fire beckons.

Home Farm Cottage ear Cirencester

Celebrated Cotswolds country retreat Barnsley House unveiled this self-catering cottage earlier this year. It replicates the hotel's elegant, country-contemporary furnishings but comes with the benefit of a private garden, two sitting rooms and high-spec kitchen, too. If you don't want to cook, the hotel's Potager restaurant is across the road and the Village Pub only a little further.
